JARDINS DU MONDE SUMMER LAUNCHES

Everything in Its Place

Adorn a countertop with Juliska's four new elaborately detailed canisters. Use one or all of them to hold everything from staples (like sugar and flour) to treats (like dog biscuits or cookies). Besides being exceedingly pretty, they're hermetically sealed to keep moisture in – or out – depending on the circumstances. See page 3.

A Grande Cup of Java

Savor significant amounts of morning coffee in our new oversized Grande Footed Mugs embellished with Juliska's signature "berry and thread" design elements. The four different mugs reflect the patterns of each of the four gardens in the Jardins du Monde Collection. See page 2.

All in the Details

Our new pitchers capture the garden scene in whimsical, charming and elaborate details – a bee on one pitcher, a flower on another and a third with cut-out definitions that create a lattice effect. In four sizes, the smallest makes a charming creamer – or nosegay vase. Use the larger pitchers to serve iced tea to a crowd. Don't put these beauties away – display them in your kitchen shelving! Charger, Serving Platter, Wall Medallion – Your Choice

With a Berry and Thread™ Dinner Plate on top of our newest charger, you'll see the "berry" garlands that encircle the scalloped edge. Remove the dinner plate and you reveal an exuberant scene inspired by the four Jardins du Monde patterns. Use as a glorious serving platter or group several on a wall. See page 2.

Keep a Lid on It

Juliska's gently rounded, lattice-detailed, individual-sized Jardins du Monde Lidded Bowl – stamped with a lion's head – is designed to keep hot things hot. Use as a petite tureen to serve peas and rice, for example, or pair with the Jardins du Monde Soup Tureen for soup. Warm the bowls first to ensure temperature control. See page 2.

Understated Elegance

Small bouquets of peonies, roses or tulips make a big statement in Juliska's ceramic Rose Bowl Vases. The simple lattice motif of the Villandry pattern ensures that the flowers will be the main focus. Thumbled segments around the base are the only other detail in this classic yet contemporary design. OCTAVIA SUMMER LAUNCHES

Star Bright

Add an explosion of detail – and exuberance – to the Octavia Collection with the *Antares* Accent Salad Plate. Named after the brightest star in the constellation Scorpio, this dish is equally stunning layered on the Octavia Dinner Plate or all by itself. See page 4.

At Your Service

Just-the-right-size covered casseroles and square and rectangular bakers are part of the new Octavia Baking and Serving Collection. Other pieces include the most delightful ramekin you're likely to find (molten chocolate cake takes on new meaning), and a salt and pepper shaker that lets you choose whether pepper warrants one shaking hole or three. Togetherness

Now soup and sandwich can comfortably snuggle on the same plate. Aptly named, Juliska's Soup and Sandwich Plate has an indentation that fits the Berry and Thread™ Berry Bowl, Tea Cup or Breakfast Cup, leaving plenty of room on the side for a sandwich or slice of quiche. Also good as an hors d'oeuvre platter when you need a dipping dish. See page 3.

Grounding for the Sauce Boat

No more drips on the tablecloth – the Berry and Thread™ Sauce Boat now has an underplate! The plate's beautiful scalloped edge is delicately detailed with “berry and thread” accents to give the sauce boat extra definition. See page 3.

NEW SUMMER GLASS LAUNCHES

Highball Glasses Round Out the Barware Scene

The Cameron and Graham Barware Collections now include Highball glasses. They're just the right size for iced tea, gin and tonic, or any other drink that's served with plenty of ice. Men particularly like the barware glasses – they're comfortable to handle and blown slightly thicker for added weight. See page 3.

Size Does Make a Difference

Juliska's Pendant Lights Collection has grown to include two smaller pieces. The Florence globe pendant (with the blobs of glass) now has a smaller sister – also named Florence, and the Amalia column pendant has a shorter cousin called Ella. Both the Amalia and Ella patterns have glass “threading” as their detail, though in different configurations. Mix the sizes and patterns to create a glorious chandelier. See page 4.
